Can you still get infected even though you run internet security software?

The answer is yes you can! Combating viruses is a four-way race:

- In the lead are malware writers looking for vulnerabilities and writing malware to exploit them.
- Coming in second are the anti-malware software vendors looking for ways to detect new malware as it appears, as well as to figure out the correct way to eradicate it when found.
- Next are the software vendors looking to plug the security holes that the malware exploited in the first place.
- *Lastly* are folks like you and me, hopefully keeping our systems up-to-date with the latest updates to both our anti-malware products as well as the systems and software that have vulnerabilities.

As you can see, virus writers are almost always in the lead. You and I? We're dead last – hopefully close to the pack, but still – last.

As a result, the answer boils down to simple bad luck. It's possible to be doing everything as right as you can and still get infected if:

- Your anti-malware software has not yet been updated to know how to detect it.
- Your system or application software has not yet been patched to fix whatever vulnerability the virus exploits.

So, the procedure is to keep your internet security programme up to date and to keep your computer up to date with security patches. For the first most, if not all, security suites update automatically when your computer is running. For the second, Windows has regular security updates that usually occur on the second Tuesday (US time) of the month, so called "patch Tuesday". Other urgent patches may occur at other times. For Windows 10 Home Edition these patches will be automatically downloaded and installed.

Which internet security suits should you use? It turns out that all the major free and paid security suites are good, but note, none can always be guaranteed 100%. There is a website www.av-test.org that tests the suites about every three months. They test a number of security suites on Windows 7, Windows 10, Apple Mac and Android systems. From their data, protection from all the suites (free and paid) is 100% or very close to 100%. Windows 10 comes with a free security suite called Windows Defender. If you do not have any other suite on your system, then this suite is activated. If you have a third-party suite installed than that suite will turn off Windows Defender. It's advised not to run more than one security suits as they may clash so that is expected.

How often should you scan your system? Most, if not all, security suites run quick or full scans. Quick scans should be run automatically by the suite at regular intervals (maybe daily), but you can always manually run the scan if you want. Full scans may not be run automatically and may need to be set up manually. Advice is to run a full scan on a monthly basis or when you suspect you may have a problem. A quick scan may take 20 minutes or so, a full scan may take a couple of hours depending on the number of files and programmes you have installed.
